ELECTION TIME IN RAINBERRY BAY

Please consider serving our community by running for the Homes, Master, or Villas Board. Meet with the Nominating Committee (NC) to ask questions about what this important volunteer job entails. Both the nine-member committee, and the Board of Directors are made up of residents like you, from all around Rainberry Bay. As always, two NC members must be past Board members, so that potential candidates may ask questions of folks with previous Board experience.

Please seek out these NC members if you have an interest in being on the Board. Please do not put the members in a difficult position by asking who else is running.

The information is strictly confidential until all paperwork and vetting has been completed. The Board of Directors openings are as follows:

- Master: One opening. Incumbent Shelley Glass is eligible to run for another term.
- Homes: One opening.
- Villas: Two openings, Incumbent Terry Barberio is eligible to run for another term.

The purpose of the NC is to seek out community members who are willing to run for one of the three Boards. The meeting with each potential candidate will last about 15 minutes to guide potential candidates through the process, to ANSWER ANY OF THEIR questions about being a RAINBERRY BAY Board Member and to help them with the paperwork process, including deadlines. It is not necessary for incumbents seeking re-election to go through this process.

Qualifications for Board candidate:

- Must be a deeded owner, current with maintenance payments
- Must have no felony convictions, unless such felon's civil rights have been restored as per statute
- All candidates will be vetted by management

If you made it to the bottom of this article, perhaps you're ready to be next year's Nominating Committee Chair. My term expired 2 years ago. I'll happily mentor you for next year.

Thanks to all our volunteers, especially our Board members. If we don't have volunteer Board members, we must, by Statute, hire outsiders.

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Master Board News

At the November budget meeting, the board became aware that with so many newer residents, some facts needed to be reviewed and clarified.

Some residents are not clear about what differentiates the associations. We are three independently budgeted associations: Homes, Master, and Villas. The Master Association handles only the common properties. The Homes and Villas are responsible for the actual living dwellings. The specifics of responsibilities are spelled out in your Documents.

The assessments (or maintenance) are separated as well. If you live in a villa, you pay Master and Villas maintenance. If you live in a home, you pay Master and Homes maintenance. Homes maintenance is split, depending on the type of unit you live in – patio home, single-family or a Riviera large lot. Villas' assessment is basically all the same except if your section has a dumpster for your convenience. You pay extra for this convenience. Villas without dumpsters pay for disposal separately with the water bill.

Homes and Villas cover outside stucco,

painting and roof repairs. You will find this information in your Documents. The criteria for roof replacement can best be explained at a Homes or Villas board meeting.

Any modifications you make to the exterior of your home needs architectural approval. You cannot make changes without approval. Doing so can result in having you remove those changes at your cost.

The Master Association covers and maintains the pools, courts, theater, clubhouse and other common amenities. It also contracts for work for the overall community such as security, roads, and trees in the common areas.

The 9-member board is made up of these three entities as well. Three people are elected to the Homes and Villas boards and three are elected specifically to Master. All nine make up the Master board and, collectively, we vote on many items that concern the community. Our Associations do not have "dedicated reserves" which means that Rainberry's reserves are one pool of money and not "dedicated" to a specific item such as roads, roofs, painting, etc. That gives us flexibility to spend the money where needed without having to have any special assessment, unlike some other communities.

It's a challenge at times but when we get things done, there is a clear sense of satisfaction.

DO YOU ENJOY RECEIVING YOUR COPY OF THE BEACON EACH MONTH?

We are currently publishing a 32-page version with paid advertisements from residents and area businesses. The Beacon started with our first residents in 1979, and has had several editors. It is self-supporting and is a committee of the board.

Today, the existence of desktop publishing and word processing software allow us to create layouts for publishing in print, in color and in digital formats. Many of you have used these kinds of programs in your business. There are two types of pages in desktop publishing: digital pages and virtual paper pages to be printed on physical paper.

We are currently using MS Publisher on a PC, but you can use any program that supports page layouts. You can create a beautiful monthly missive with any of the following programs: Adobe FrameMaker, Adobe PageMaker, Adobe InDesign, Affinity Publisher, Corel Ventura, CorelDraw, Microsoft Publisher, PageStream, and QuarkXPress.ms.

Both of Microsoft's programs, Word and Publisher, have become indispensable tools for desktop publishers and anyone trying to create an item to print or distribute online. These programs provide complete page design capabilities, including magazine style columns, rules and borders, page, chapter and caption numbering as well as precise typographic alignment.

On YouTube, you can find tutorials on how to use these programs to create a newsletter. You don't need to be a graphic designer or a writer to edit the Beacon.This is your chance to make the Beacon your own. You can be as creative as you want. It truly becomes a labor of love.







WHAT IS HEALTH LITERACY?

"HOW WELL DO YOU UNDERSTAND YOUR HEALTH?"

"Literacy" is defined as the ability to speak, read, write, listen and understand. Health literacy refers to these same skills in a healthcare setting. People who have high health literacy can successfully find, process, and understand health information and use that information to make healthcare decisions. Unfortunately, navigating the healthcare system can be very confusing, and not understanding it can present significant challenges, such as difficulty making appointments or taking medication correctly, and many of these challenges can have both short- and long-term health consequences.

Why is health literacy important?

Studies show that by the time a patient leaves an appointment, he or she will have forgotten half of the information discussed during the visit, making it difficult to appropriately follow your doctor's instructions. These issues can be complicated even further if the patient didn't understand some or most of what was discussed during the appointment, and that lack of understanding and retention can lead to poor health consequences. For example, those with low health literacy often spend more money on healthcare, have health problems such as depression, heart disease, diabetes, and stroke, and are two times more likely to visit the emergency room.

That's why it's so important to develop skills that help you improve your health literacy, understand your doctor and make smart healthcare decisions.

The first step in improving your health literacy is understanding how you learn. Everyone has a different learning style and knowing yours can help you find the best way to learn and remember information. There are three main learning styles: visual, aural, and kinesthetic.

VISUAL

Visual learners learn by seeing. They usually prefer reading written instructions or looking at graphics to get information. If this applies to you, ask your doctor if you can take any pamphlets home about your condition or if you can have your instructions for treatment printed on a piece of paper. Your doctor might also be able to recommend a good website with resources you can read to learn more.

AURAL (AUDITORY)

Aural learners learn best by listening and speaking. If you are an aural learner, practice having a discussion with your doctor by asking questions. Some good questions to ask include:

- What condition do I have and what can I do about it?
- What are my treatment options?
- How do I take this medication? Are there side effects?
- How do I approach diet and exercise with this condition?

You can also ask to clarify the information in your own words to make sure you understand your doctor or bring along a family member that can discuss your treatment with you after you leave your doctor's office.

KINESTHETIC/TACTILE

People with a kinesthetic or tactile learning style remember information through action or experience. If "hands-on" learning is most effective for you, try taking notes throughout your appointment using a notebook. The physical activity of writing down information can help you remember it better.

If your doctor gives you physical instructions, ask if you can do it in the office while he or she guides you. For example, if you need insulin injections, practice giving yourself a shot in the office.

A second step on the path to health literacy is asking questions and knowing where to go for answers. Sometimes people feel uncomfortable asking questions after a provider explains something during an appointment, but in most cases, the provider would rather have you ask questions or request more resources than have you leave the appointment without a clear understanding of your disease, treatment options, and next steps. Don't be afraid to ask for clarification if there is something you don't understand.

As patients, it can sometimes feel frustrating to try and navigate the healthcare system, but one of the best ways to prevent unnecessary healthcare spending and improve your health is to understand your own health and the treatment options available to you, and know where to go to get more information when you don't understand it.

INFORMATION PLEASE

USES FOR RUBBING ALCOHOL



This commonplace household item is extremely helpful to have on hand. It can be used for a variety of different things.

REMOVE STUBBORN STICKERS:

Rubbing alcohol can help you remove stickers. Soak the whole sticker in alcohol and leave it for ten minutes. The rubbing alcohol works to dissolve the adhesive, making it easy to wipe the sticker and its goo away with ease.

REMOVE STAINS FROM MICROFIBER

If you happen to stain the microfiber upholstery on your furniture try rubbing alcohol. Gently mist some rubbing alcohol over the areas you want to clean using a spray bottle. Afterwards, just wipe it clean with a sponge or a cloth.

CLEAN YOUR ELECTRONICS

With daily use, our electronics need to be disinfected regularly. Rubbing alcohol is a perfect cleaner because it evaporates quickly, leaving less opportunity for the moisture to damage your devices. Just apply a bit of rubbing alcohol to a cotton swab and wipe it across your device and lightly wipe it with a clean microfiber cloth.

MAKE YOUR SMELLY SHOES MUCH MORE PLEASANT

To deodorize smelly shoes, spray the insides with rubbing alcohol using a fine mist spray bottle and then set them outside to dry in the sun. The combination of alcohol and sunlight helps to kill the bacteria that are creating the stink.

CLEAN YOUR BLINDS

Cleaning the slats on Venetian blinds can be a bit easier if you use rubbing alcohol. To maximize efficiency, wrap a flat tool like a spatula in cloth and secure it using a rubber band. Soak the cloth end in a bowl of rubbing alcohol and get to work moving it across the tops and bottoms of the slats of your blinds. This method is easy and the slats dry quickly.

The 2023 print version of the Directory will be sourced from the (updated) electronic Directory. Remember to update your information whenever you change telephone numbers or email addresses or other relevant data or circumstances. If you had different information in the print and electronic versions in 2021, you'll need to complete a new form.

New residents need to make sure they complete the Directory Inclusion form provided to them by First Service or the Welcome Committee. They'll receive a hard copy of the Rainberry Directory, copies of which were given out at multiple distributions and / or hand delivered during the past year. Copies are also available by contacting the FSR office.

Telephone numbers are <u>automatically included</u> in the Directory <u>unless you write "NO"</u> in the box next to each phone number you want to have excluded.

Email addresses will be included in the Directory only if you write "YES" in the box next to each email address on the form. If your email addresses were in the 2021 electronic Directory, they will be in the 2023 directory.



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
