HOA ELECTIONS SIMPLIFIED

Karen Wells, Elections Chair

Every year, a specific number of Board positions become available for transition. At Rainberry, in 2022, 5 positions are available on the 9-member Board of Directors. The Search/Nominating Committee is hard at work interviewing interested candidates.

Florida law states that for a person to be eligible for board membership, they must be an owner, be 18 years of age or older, and be not more than 90 days delinquent in the payment of any fee, fine or monetary obligation to the Association as of the date of the Notice of Intent.

If a convicted felon, civil rights must have been restored for a minimum of 5 years.

The number of members on the board of directors is fixed in the bylaws or in the articles. Members of the Rainberry Bay board can serve for terms of two years and our bylaws permit terms of no more than 2 consecutive terms (4 years). There must be one year off before being elected or appointed to the current Board.

Our elections are conducted pursuant to our governing documents, by General or Limited Proxy, by Secret Absentee Ballot, by Ballot, in person, at the meeting or by Electronic Vote. There must be a 30% quorum of secret and electronic votes for each association for the election. An election is not required unless more candidates are nominated than vacancies exist.

BY SECRET BALLOT:

Place your marked ballot in the proper inner envelope (HOMES, VILLAS, or MASTER) with no identifying markings, place it in the outer envelope bearing identifying information of name, address, and signature of owner casting the ballot and mail or deliver it to the office.

If the eligibility of the member to vote is confirmed and no other ballot has been submitted for that lot or parcel, the inner envelope shall be removed from the outer envelope bearing the identification information, and placed with the



If more than one ballot is submitted for a lot or parcel, the ballots for that lot shall be disqualified.

BY ELECTRONIC VOTE:

If you have already signed up, your ballot will be sent to you by email after Candidate's Night and you can vote any time of day or night until March 2, 2022, at 12:00 noon. Your ballot will be time stamped in the system.

If you have not signed up yet, do so. We found this is the most efficient, safe way to vote, and it saves us a lot of money in printing and postage. Please participate in the most important election we have.

Any vote by ballot received after the closing of the balloting on March 2nd will not be considered.

MONTHLY MANAGEMENT REPORT: JANUARY 2022

ELECTRONIC VOTING:

- We began Electronic Voting last year and it will be used again for voting on our documents and, later, for the Board election. It was a success and saved us money. We urge you to join in making our process easier and more costefficient.
- You may go directly to https://rainberry-bay.myhoast.com and register there.
- Call Management Office if you have any questions.
- Blank Forms can be emailed to you or picked up inside the Clubhouse entry.

IRRIGATION ISSUES:

- Our irrigation system has had all repairs completed and is running better than ever.
- We are continuously trying to make the current system more efficient.
- Our new Tennis Pro is overseeing the courts and working with Management help to get the courts watered properly.
 We will advise of progress.
- The lake fountain is functioning properly and the lights are working.
- Dedicated irrigation line for Pickleball courts has been completed and is running great.

RIVIERA ENTRANCE GATE:

- Available for residents with Barcodes only.
- All guests and deliveries must enter through Lake Ida's main entrance, as always.
- A camera has been installed on the exit side of Riviera gate to monitor vehicles exiting Community.

AMENITIES:

 We are getting more proposals for a better lighting plan for the Pickleball courts 11 & 12 to be submitted for approval by the Board.

ROADWAY PROJECT:

- Permitting process is currently being renegotiated.
- Progress is being made but we still face obstacles.
- We are trying to save as many trees from removal as we can, determined by our Arborist report and City of Delray Beach Engineers.

LANDSCAPING:

- The community will be removing trees that are a nuisance and doing damage to buildings and utility services.
- Several hedges have been added to our perimeter hedge to fill in for better security and privacy. The project is ongoing.
- Palm Beach Broward Landscaping moving forward making the community better through its cycles of service.
- The Board approved that the north perimeter tree/hedge will be cut back excessively.
- PBB is continually adjusting the new irrigation system to provide consistent watering.
- Community border hedges have all been reduced in size to a maintainable level. Schedule maps are available.
- Community planting improvements are being done upon recommendation from our Landscape Committee.

MISCELLANEOUS:

- As always, we appreciate constructive input from our community.
- The Landscaping Oversight Committee is continually completing small projects to enhance the optics of our community.
- Please be reminded that any changes to the exterior of any unit must be approved by the ACC Committee before any work being done. Application forms can be obtained at the management office. Please call to request.
- The ducks should not be fed. It is unhealthy for them and for our beautiful lake, contributing to bad algae. Please refrain from feeding any of the wildlife on our grounds.

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MEET YOUR NEIGHBOR: DAVE KULICK

We knew we had a winner when we elected Dave President of our Homeowners Association. Before that, he was involved in doing lighting and sound in our theater. If you attend the movies shown in the theater. you see Dave running the equipment for the free movies on Tuesday and Sunday evenings. Before the pandemic, when we used to attend board meetings in the clubhouse, Dave gave technical assistance with microphones and video cameras. His professional knowledge about all things electronic made him indispensable. He worked on bringing our official HOA documents up to date. Lately he even programmed the locations and schedules of every sprinkler on our property. Nowadays, he walks around to check up on them.

Dave said, "I can't help it. If it's programable, automatically I'll just work it out." I saw the chart he made that shows the schedule for each sprinkler. Wow!

Dave has had a long love affair with computers. It began in high school when he and computers were both young. Learning came easy and he concentrated on the subjects which attracted him. At that time his primary goal was to have fun.

In his freshman year at Stonybrook College in Long Island, using primitive equipment, Dave programmed a hockey game between the Boston Bruins and the New York Rangers. His thesis was that the more a player successfully passed a puck to a team member before shooting for a goal, the more likely he would score. Otherwise, the competing team would score. To me, programming sounded like an impossible dream. But Dave said all it entailed was breaking the problems down into steps, solving each problem and then placing them in their proper order. Okay. Simple! But I think I'll stick to writing articles.

During Dave's four years at Stonybrook, there were lots of things going on in the world. "On their parents' money," he said, "Students held moratoriums and strikes to protest the war in Viet Nam." Many of the country's famous rock and roll bands appeared on campus. The Grateful Dead played there on Halloween in 1970, his first of many Grateful Dead concerts. Other



popular bands at the time, like Zappa and Traffic, held huge concerts. Studies took a back seat to music and other social events. For example, Dave majored in Pinball and became an excellent player, minoring in Frisbee.

With a bachelor's degree in Biology Dave became a microbiology lab technician at Booth Memorial Hospital which was owned by the Salvation Army. These kinds of jobs did not pay much. For Dave, helping people was a reward in itself. His parents tended towards socialistic idealism and had become involved with folk music performers. His parents attended folk music concerts and hosted famous folksingers in their home. Much to Dave's delight, Pete Seeger was one of their quests.

During this period, Dave achieved a master's degree in Medical Biology at C. W. Post University, at night, in Long Island. Following that, he took computer classes at the New School for Social Research in Manhattan. He learned how to program in different computer languages. He then enrolled in Continuing Education courses at New York University and applied to enter a twelve-week programming class for which he had to first take an aptitude test. Out of three hundred who took the test, Dave had the third highest grade and was one of the 120 who got into the course. His flirtation with computers became a full-fledged affair.

Following his experience at Booth Memorial Hospital, Dave took a job at Bankers Trust Company. He was prepared to use his expertise in the cause of big business. One day his boss placed a clone of an IBM personal computer on his desk and said, "Show me how you make a

money transfer on this p.c." Dave became a master of this new technology. He bought one of the first IBM clones. He could take it apart and put it back together. He would buy a motherboard, a new CPU, and memory port. Then he would build a new computer with the only original part being the case.

Bankers Trust offered their employees a savings incentive plan. For every dollar an employee put in, the bank would put in two dollars. With the money he saved, Dave invested in Microsoft which enabled him to retire to Rainberry Bay and enjoy life here.

One of his jobs was to computerize clinical laboratories. The computer analyzed the specimen, ran the test and returned the result to the patient's record. Dave wrote the interfaces between the machines. Amazing!

Until Dave moved here, Queens was his home base. His jobs were in Manhattan. Every weekday morning he would carry his bicycle on the subway and pedal his way home every evening. He didn't want to get to work sweaty in the morning. He skipped bike riding in the winter when the temperature dropped below 20 degrees. After a few months, he began biking round trip and did so for years.

His last job was at the New York City Legal Aid Society which was located in the South Street Seaport. It was perfect for his daily bike ride over the Williamsburg Bridge. Bike riding is Dave's pleasure and you can often see him cruising around the lake and around our streets.

At the same time that he was thinking of retiring and moving to Rainberry Bay, his mom, MARIANE KULICK, one of our prominent residents, was thinking of moving to Queens to be near Dave. But he beat her to it when, to her delight, he bought a house here instead. Then Dave's cousin, MICHAEL CANTWELL and his wife, SANDY, moved here also. It was a perfect solution.

A computer couldn't have come up with a better solution for this family.


Our next meeting is January 6. NANCY EFFRAIN will present "The Book Woman Of Troublesome Creek." by Kim Michele Richardson.



Keeping Us Informed

MULTIPURPOSE VINEGAR

Lois Wiesler

Per Bob Vila: whether your house is in need of deodorizing or descaling, just pull out the jug of vinegar and refer to these tips:

CLEAN A SHOWER HEAD.

Clogged shower heads can reduce your water pressure. To restore it, fill a medium-sized bowl with equal parts cup vinegar and boiling water, then submerge the shower head in the solution for 10 minutes. Or, if you can't remove it from the wall, fill a large sandwich or freezer bag halfway with just vinegar, tape or rubber-band it around the head, and leave it there for at least an hour. The mineral build-up will loosen so that you can simply brush it away once time is up—and enjoy full shower power during your next soak.

REFRESH YOUR FRIDGE.

To get rid of less-than-fresh odors, try cleaning with vinegar. Clear your fridge of its contents, combine two parts water with one part vinegar in a spray bottle, and spritz it all over the appliance's empty interior. Let the solution sit for 20 minutes to loosen up any dried spills before wiping everything down with a microfiber cloth. Repeat if necessary.

CLEAN YOUR MICROWAVE.

Steaming your microwave's interior effectively loosens up even the toughest gunk. Just place a small glass bowl of equal parts water and vinegar (½ cups to one cup each) and microwave it for five to 10 minutes. Once the machine's timer sounds, you should be able to wipe away the grime and grease from the steamed interior with ease.

GET RID OF LITTER BOX ODORS.

Empty the litter box, fill it with ½ inch of vinegar for 20 minutes, and rinse with cold water.

DESCALE YOUR TEA KETTLE.

Vinegar will remove lime scales. Fill it halfway with equal parts cold water and white vinegar, then either turn on the stove under the kettle or plug in your electric appliance to bring the solution to a boil. Once the water is boiling, turn off the heat and allow the vinegar-water solution to sit in the kettle for 30 minutes to an hour. Empty the kettle and rinse the interior with cold water and wipe away any lingering limescale with a clean, damp cloth (no scrubbing necessary). Then, boil clean water for your next beverage to prevent any vinegary aftertaste from seeping into future cups of tea.
