

MASTER BOARD NEWS JOE MALTEZO, **PRESIDENT**

I want to update everyone on all of the projects and events occurring here at Rainberry:

1. The Roads Project: All of the trees that were designated for removal on the circle have been removed, and the stumps have been ground down.

The new trees were delivered and most have been planted. The 4 Gumbo trees on the circle will be relocated by pool 4. The landscape architect has revised the tree plan for pool 4.

Ranger, the paving company, has been back on site since September 23 installing curbs and positioning the new car stops in the Villas. After this is complete, they will start to mill the remaining roads and parking lots in preparation for paving.

- 2. We had lightning strike a tree on NW 14th St. It needed an emergency removal due to the dangerous limbs hanging over the road. At the same time, the irrigation station near the tree was also struck by lightning and has to be replaced. Some areas will not have irrigation until that station is replaced.
- 3. There is another sink hole forming on NW 25th Avenue.
- 4. We discovered a buried propane tank while doing a terrain walk at the theater. It was previously used to heat pool 5. There are 2 more at pools 1 and 4. A vendor came to look at them and he advised that they are still filled with propane. The vendor will empty them and fill the tanks with water.

- 5. Our new vendor Tek Bee is working on the installation of the new cameras and wireless network for the phones and internet utilized by the office, the clubhouse, the guardhouse and the Tennis Center. This is the project that the Board approved in our efforts to improve service and save money. This will replace Comcast Business and will save us over \$2000 per month. As a courtesy to our residents they have also installed hotspots at all 5 pools.
- 6. Access Control Project: The purpose of this project is to improve security and reduce the cost of security at the front gate. Our treasurer is conducting a cost/benefit analysis for discussion at the next board meeting.
- 7. The Board approved the purchase of new furniture for Pool 5. The furniture has been ordered. Small tables for Pool 1 were also ordered. It may take up to 10 weeks to be delivered.
- 8. We will begin to enforce violations for the illegal plantings in Villas, Homes and Master Common Property. These plants and trees were planted without approval of the Architectural Control Committee continually vote, and it is a and on property that did not belong to the planters. They have not been maintained and have created an evesore for the community. Some have actually caused damage to property, such as the rubber tree on the circle that had to be removed by the Villas Association.
- 9. The Board approved our intent to renew our contract with Comcast before the current contract expires in February 2025. The new contract will provide some savings per household. The specifics will be explained after the contract is reviewed and signed.

Finally, I want to remind

everyone to vote on the 2 new amendments that we are trying to pass. Vote electronically if you signed up for it or by paper ballot if you did not sign up for electronic. Contact the office if you are having difficulties voting.

The purpose of Amendment One is to prohibit Air BnBs and rentals of single rooms in Rainberry Bav.

The purpose of Amendment Two is to reduce the number of votes needed to pass any new amendments and make changes to articles in our documents. According to our current Master documents, we need 451 affirmative votes to approve any new amendments to our documents. If every lot were to cast a vote, either for or against the amendments, that would be ideal, and we wouldn't need to change the number.

The fact is that every lot does not cast a vote for whatever reason. What that means is that those who don't usually vote will determine whether our documents get updated or not. That is not fair to the responsible lot owners who disservice to our community. This is what happened in 2020 when the last vote was taken. By reducing the number of lots voting to meet a quorum, we would still need the majority of affirmative votes cast to approve anything we vote on. We are not trying to limit the number of lots to be able to vote. We still want everyone to vote and if they do, that will be fantastic. We simply do not want to allow those who don't and will never vote to influence the will of those lot owners who take the time to vote.

We look forward to welcoming back our seasonal owners. Safe travels to you.



Our landscape committee has been working closely with Rainberry management, our HOA to prioritize areas within our community for sustainable improvements. In our search,



Here are just 3 of these problem plants:

POTHOS Vine: a very fast spreading vine that has covered large areas of Rainberry Bay. The community has removed one area and are deciding on the removal of another problem pothos site. These removals are costing us thousands of dollars! If you cannot resist this plant, please contain it in a

ARECA Palms: These, and many other palms, have the ganaderma virus that spreads easily and quickly killing the palms. Other reasons to not plant or to remove: very messy for cleanup and rats like to live in overgrown patches!

SCHEFFLERA Trees: These are the large trees that have the purple spikes that are sending out many seeds for more trees. These roots ARE growing into our foundations, so should be removed if they are close to your home.

Homeowners should look at their trees and determine if you have invasive trees and plan to have them removed before it causes expensive structural damage to your property. If you have any questions, you can email RainBerryBay@fsresidential.com for assistance.

Please note "INVASIVES" in the subject area.

Please be cautious about what and where you plant. One popular shrub is Clusia. This plant, if not frequently trimmed, WILL become a tree with large roots spreading to yours and your neighbors' homes.







Excerpted from **Meet Your Neighbor—Arnold Welber** a 2019 feature article

written by Phyllis Gordon Berke for The BEACON

"A Genuine War Hero. Arnold, we thank you for your service...

1940's...Arnold, age 18 enlisted in the Navy. He was permanently assigned to a minesweeper which traveled around the Philippine Islands, Okinawa and west of Japan in preparation for an invasion. The ship was built of wood rather than metal because magnetic forces would set off mines...It turned out that he was on one of the most dangerous missions of the war. The seas around his destinations were laced with mines. His ship would send out cables with electric pulses. These cables detonated mines at some distance from his ship. Arnold served as a wheel man on the ship. The captain stood in a cabin above Arnold's deck and would order him to steer according to his command...

For his service in the Pacific area, Arnold was awarded three medals;-the American Theater Medal, the Asiatic Pacific Medal with One Battle Star, and the Occupation of the Philippines Victory Medal...After the atomic bomb was dropped, his ship was stationed off Okinawa. There was a deadly typhoon storm which destroyed many ships and lost hundreds of men at sea. His ship was saved because it entered an inlet where it became grounded. They were rescued by a naval operations ship...

(Arnold Welber passed away on July 19, 2024 at age 97. He was a Rainberry Bay resident since 1991)
