U.S. House Prices Rise 3.0 Percent over the Last Year; Up 1.7 Percent from the First Quarter

Washington, D.C. – U.S. house prices rose **3.0 percent** between the second quarters of 2022 and 2023, according to the Federal Housing Finance Agency (FHFA) House Price Index (FHFA HPI®). House prices were up **1.7 percent** compared to the first quarter of 2023. FHFA's seasonally adjusted monthly index for June was up **0.3 percent** from May.


"U.S. house prices appreciated at a slightly higher rate in the second quarter amid low inventory," said Dr. Anju Vajja, Principal Associate Director in FHFA's Division of Research and Statistics. "While prices in a number of western states continued to decline year-over-year, house prices rose in all states quarter-over-quarter."

- Address issues for fees & work orders

Theater entertainment for a nominal fee **Many active and approved clubs**

Website to open work orders, phone directory, calendar information, review HOA contracts, etc.


Annual Tree Trimming that helps the wind blow through trees during high winds/tropical storms/hurricanes



Although it has been on NY Times Best Seller List for almost a year, the title of the MEMOIR may seem

to be offensive to many and perhaps it is. Arguably, this book has something interesting and important to say to all of us. The author is a former "TV child star", the victim of a controlling, over-protective mother, and an uncaring television industry. McCurdy describes her demanding life as a child performer, and how she tried to survive in that milieu, unfortunately becoming a food addict, among other things. She describes (with a kind of dark humor) her difficult journey from a vulnerable little girl to the woman she is today, exposing the abuse to which she was subjected.

Peak Season is STILL Here


Hurricane season is officially over at the end of November. But we can tend to become complacent when the temperatures begin to cool and the holidays draw closer. With climate change, we see storms earlier as well as later than the "traditional" hurricane season June 1st to November 30th. That's why it's important to review your supplies from time to time and keep your "go bag" packed. Besides hurricanes, power outages can occur during any strong storm. So keep a flashlight handy and make sure you would be safe if the lights suddenly went out. Check that your area rugs are secure (taped down or on non-skid pads) and minimize small

pieces of furniture in pathways you would normally walk in. Check the clubhouse lobby for FSR's hurricane preparedness manual as well as guidelines and applications for special needs shelters. If you do have special needs, or know someone who does, look at this material asap. Call the number provided to see if you can still reserve a spot should you need it. Review safety protocols and Rainberry rules for running a generator. Look over your inventory of



SOLAR PANELS & BEER? ELECTRIC POWER & LIMA BEANS?

A small 32-acre farm in Southern Germany is using solar panels that rise above the field of hops. These are the hops used to make fine German beers. In addition to making the hops less susceptible to disease and needing as much as 16% less water for irrigation, the solar panels also generate electricity.

Though the electricity generated will power only 250 homes, it will soon be upgraded to power about 2,500 homes at virtually no additional cost.

Growers in many African nations are studying and emulating the same procedures as they seek ways to increase crop yield, reduce the amount of precious water needed to irrigate, and to provide low carbon producing electricity.

Crops already benefitting from being cultivated under solar panels include maize, swiss chard, beans, onions, and sweet peppers.

In the African country of Tanzania, about 50% of

the farmers plant maize. This is a particularly interesting process. The crop yield so far has increased about 11%, which is considered "A phenomenal Result". In addition, this arid country will use much less water for its irrigation.

The farm in Germany is the first agricultural project solely devoted to hops. The hops are healthier and retain more moisture when planted under solar panels. A scientific analysis will be concluded in October and if successful, as expected, it will lead to a large number of growers adopting this practice.

As researchers study making the best use of agricultural land and farmers seek ways to shield their crops from an increasingly warm planet, many countries are looking to use the procedure for an increasing variety of grains, fruits, and vegetables.

This is another example of the many ways that technology, used responsibly, can be a helpful partner in working on the planet's issues,

Irrigation

By Dave Kulick

I wanted to explain the importance of pump station 2, now back online. Pump Station 2 contains a small pump called the Jockey.

The whole system depends on the pressure in the pipes, normally around 70psi (pounds per square inch). There is no central brain that turns things on. Instead, the 30 clocks that irrigate different sections of RB at different times turn on when they're supposed to and the pressure

in the line drops as water shoots out. When the pressure drops below 50psi, the first main pump to detect the drop turns on and the pressure climbs. If that pump isn't enough, more pumps come on until the pressure climbs above 50. This is the normal operation.

When there are no clocks running, the system is idle. Since all irrigation systems leak, the pressure slowly drops. When it drops below 55psi, the Jockey comes on and pushes the pressure back up to 70 and then turns off. The pressure begins dropping

again, and the Jockey runs again, etc.

Without PS2 and the Jockey, the main pumps cycled on and off keeping up the pressure, but that's not their job and they shut off with an error condition. So for the last 10 months, we've been restarting the pumps manually as needed but we were trying to run 24 hours so the system never went idle. Mostly successfully.

Now that PS2 (and the Jockey) are back online, we will be changing some schedules per city regulations and hopefully will be more stable.

COREY JONES ISLE

Do you recall a series of protests by NFL players, including San Francisco 49er Colin Kaepernick, who kneeled during the playing of the National Anthem at a Green Bay Packers pre-game in August, 2016?



This highly publicized event was sparked by senseless murders of black men by police officers, including one of our own, Corey Jones. Five years later, the city of Delray Beach constructed an affordable housing development, named Corey Jones Isle to honor his name and to remember him for all the good he did for his community, family and friends. Corey Jones was born in Palm Beach Gardens in

1984. He had four siblings as well as two cousins who played in the National Football League. Corey attended Santa Luces High School, where he was on the football team, and graduated from the University of Akron with a double major in music and business



administration in 2006. He worked as a youth mentor for the nonprofit organization, My Brother's Keeper, was a drummer for a Boynton Beach church band called Future Presidents, and was an Inspector/Assistant Property Manager for

the City of Delray Beach Housing Authority. In October 2015, Corey was killed by a Palm Beach Gardens police officer while waiting for roadside assistance for his disabled car.

In September 2021, the Delray Beach Community Land Trust opened Corey Jones Isle with 10 single-family homes designed to ensure long-term affordability and to preserve the cultural heritage of the neighborhood, originally settled by Bahamian and other Caribbean islanders. The homes, ranging in size from 1,800 to 2,300 sq. ft., are located at the northwest corner of SW 7th Ave and SW 4th St, the site of a former commercial plant nursery. Buyers included mostly Delray Beach residents, young professionals, retired veterans, seniors, and healthcare workers. Take a ride to Corey Jones Isle to see these beautiful homes and to honor the memory of Corey Jones.



When I called Medicare's hotline on behalf of my mom, they said they couldn't help me because she didn't sign some form. What is that about?

If you put your mom on the phone, she can give verbal authorization for the Medicare representative to help you with her issue. Failing that, yes, your mother needs to submit Medicare's "Authorization

to Disclose Personal Information" form before you can speak for her. That's true even if you have your mom's health care proxy or power of attorney. Once the form is accepted, you'll be able to talk to an agent about claims, enrollment issues, payments, and more.

Even if your mom is fully capable of handling her account, it's wise for her to fill this form out, since you never know

when she might need help. The form will ask your mom to say when and how long to allow Medicare to give you representation rights - a permission she can revoke anytime. Find the form at medicare.gov. Or if your mom has an online Medicare account. She can log in and click on Edit My Account Settings, then on Manage My Representatives. **Editors Note:** This pertains to

spouses also.

Safe Weed Killing Tips Lois Wiesler

Dish Soap Solution

Explanation: Vinegar alone is extremely effective in killing weeds but mixing it with dish soap and salt is even more deadly.

Directions: Mix one gallon of white vinegar, one cup of table salt, and one tablespoon of liquid dishwashing soap and generously pour it on your weeds, careful not to get it on any plants you want to survive.

Vinegar

Directions: When using vinegar, it's best to pour a small amount into a spray bottle. This way, you can control over its application. Pouring the vinegar might be too much for the rest of your garden, so containing it in one area will help you avoid killing your other beloved plants and flowers. Avoid rainy or windy

days, as this will dilute and spread the solution elsewhere. You can use either white or apple cider vinegar for this solution.



Salt Solution

Explanation: Salt dehydrates weeds and absorbs moisture from their soil. Remember that once the soil is exposed to salt, it takes time to re-

cover and obtain moisture again and might not be the best option to apply throughout your entire garden. Directions: Add about two cups of salt to one gallon of water and pour it or spray it on your weeds and the soil around them. Only do this if you aren't planning on growing more vegetation in that area, as the soil will likely not recover for some time.

Baking Soda

Explanation: Baking soda is used to kill a variety of plants, fungus, moss, and weeds.

Directions: Before adding baking soda to your garden or weeds, wet the area first by watering the soil. Then, sprinkle some baking soda directly onto the weeds and their soil.

Lemon Juice

Explanation: Lemon juice is highly acidic, and it will quickly and naturally kill weeds. The product works exceptionally on its own.

Directions: Add lemon juice to a spray bottle and apply it directly to your weeds and the soil around them so it will kill them permanently.
