





DID YOU KNOW?

Allan Trust

Who runs the best schools in the country? The answer may be the Defense Department. That surprising answer comes from a recent article in the NY Times. After my own AI (Artificial Intelligence) aided research, that statement appears to be true.

Operated by the Department of Defense, the system has about 69,000 students, 8,700 teachers, with schools in 7 States, 11 foreign countries, and 2 territories.

These are accredited and track the progress of their students thru a variety of assessments. It compares favorably with school districts of similar size.

The results are more impressive when considering several factors:

*High mobility rates

*50% of the students live in households below the poverty level.

*The majority of students have parents with only a H.S. education.

*All ethnic groups progress at the same pace.

HOW does the Defense Department do it? The system is well funded. It spends about \$25,000 annually per student. This amount equals the highest spending in the United States. It offers high salaries and benefits.

A sociologist from Brown University said "The D of D's results showed what could happen when all students were given the resources of a typical middle-class child such as housing, health care, food, and quality teachers.

The goal is to raise the floor for all students. This is similar to educational policies of top performing countries like Finland.

A leading educator from Harvard says "If the D of D were a state, we would all be traveling there to figure out what's going on."

Considering all the negative comments we hear regarding the US educational system, perhaps more attention should be given to our own Department of Defense model.




perhaps it will be a good decision. If we don't try, we'll never know.

RAINBERRY BAY HAS A NEW ELECTRONIC VOTING VENDOR — SIGN UP!

Eletronic voting is not new to Rainberry Bay residents. Rainberry Bay opted into electronic voting several years ago, shortly after Florida adopted regulations to implement the electronic voting statute. At the time of our last election in March 2023,

roughly half of Rainberry Bay residents had consented to vote electronically.

When residents consent to electronic voting, they agree to receive all voting and notices for meetings of the Board of Directors, including Annual and Special Meetings of the Master, Homes, or Villas Boards through email. The email contains a link or links to the documents or ballots needed at the time. Mailed paper notices and absentee ballots are no longer sent, unless the resident(s) rescind or do not consent to receive electronic notices. There are

many reasons to consent to e-voting. An obvious big rea-

son is that is saves the HOA money. Your money. Whether it is used for the Annual Meeting and Election, or other HOA business, printing and mailing costs are a significant expense.

Also, the process of manually registering voters and tallying absentee ballots and in person ballots is time consuming and tedious. E-Votes are submitted electronically and are immediately dated and time stamped and securely stored by the third-party contractor. You immediately receive confirmation that your vote has been received. At the close of voting, the anonymous e-vote tally is provided by the vendor to

from boiled potatoes. But Nusha learned many years ago from her first mother-in-law, to use raw potatoes. Mrs. Sinnreich, and Nusha's delicious potato latke recipe came all the way from Zagreb, Croatia.

Nusha's Potato Latkes Recipe

5 large Idaho potatoes* 5 TBS matzo meal 3 TBS minced onion 2 eggs 1 tbsp vegetable oil salt & pepper to taste vegetable oil for cooking Peel and grate potatoes If grated in a food processor



drain potatoes of water Mix all ingredients

Heat oil in a frying pan to 350 (I like to use an electric frying pan)

Take a soup spoon amount of the mixture and place it in the pan applying slight pressure. When edges turn slightly brown flip them over

Drain on paper towels before serving . Serve with applesauce or sour cream.

Editor's note: Always work quickly with grated, raw potatoes. If you leave them sitting for too long the starch in the potatoes will cause them to oxidize and discolor.


