Homes Board News

JOHN ENGLISH

As we move from 2022 to 2023, I would like to thank the many homeowners that I have engaged with during my first year as a board member. To address the many needs described to me over the year, I think it's appropriate to lay out the hot topics for the board for 2023:

IMPROVE OUR APPEARANCE

As the roads project continues, we are focused on allowing homeowners to paint their homes with choices of colors detailed in a presentation later this year. Additionally, we are placing the landscaping company on notice that we are changing the model to performance metrics and improved communications. This will become a topic for our first several board meetings.

COMMUNICATIONS

One of the challenges we have within Rainberry is a mix of technology-aware, somewhat-aware, and not-aware homeowners. This should not prevent us from using

technology and common sense to improve communications, better information on our website, and our email notices. There have been a few enhancements in 2022 such as the voice notices and the re-opening of the office doors of FSR (our property management) during regular business hours. (These were completed at the request of the Masters Association.) We can do better!

ELIMINATION OF THE SINS OF THE PAST! We have 2 significant issues that re-occur be

We have 2 significant issues that re-occur here at Rainberry.

1. The fences between 15th Street and Riviera Drive. This issue has been kicked down the road since 1986. Lawyers have been engaged; homeowners are annoyed; much analysis happens; then other things take priority and it gets kicked down the road. We need to engage the homeowners affected, and discuss and recommend alternatives. We have concluded that homes will take ownership

- of the chain link fence, but how it will be deployed, when it can happen and other concerns still need to be ironed out through the year.
- 2. Our Bylaws and Declarations (commonly referred to as the "docs" or "documents"). They are outdated with several amendments to stay compliant with Florida Statutes. There is a temporary committee being led by the Board President with assistance from Karen Clouser (yes, that Karen!) and several other homeowners to redraft them and add new language that helps HOAs stay current with changes in the law without having to do costly updates to stay legal. It is a herculean effort, but it must be done.

In closing, we hope you are enjoying your holiday celebrations and the Homes board looks forward to a wonderful New Year!

The principles laid out in the document can serve as important guideposts for all those involved in our community: residents, guests, board and committee members, community association managers, staff members, business partners, and contractors. - 6. We believe these commitments to civility, as well as engaged and informed residents, are a vital part of our shared goal of being a vibrant, thriving community. These commitments are guiding principles. They are not governing documents or legally enforceable and do not give rise to penalties if they are not followed.

- 6. Talk, listen, respect.

- 1. Distribute the document and discuss the pledge among your friends and neighbors, at book clubs, classes, clubs, sports events within the community.
- 2. Explain why this is important to you personally and the benefits it can create.
- 3. Review and discuss the merits of the principles any activity you participate within the community.
- 4. Provide whatever input you can to the board.
- 5. Make certain the board votes to adopt a resolution participating in and endorsing the Civility Pledge.

DO YOU ENJOY RECEIVING YOUR COPY OF THE BEACON EACH MONTH?

We are currently publishing a 32-page version with paid advertisements from residents and area businesses. The Beacon started with our first residents in 1979, and has had several editors. It is self-supporting and is a committee of the board.

Today, the existence of desktop publishing and word processing software allow us to create layouts for publishing in print, in color and in digital formats. Many of you have used these kinds of programs in your business. There are two types of pages in desktop publishing: digital pages and virtual paper pages to be printed on physical paper.

We are currently using MS Publisher on a PC, but you can use any program that supports page layouts. You can create a beautiful monthly missive with any of the following programs: Adobe FrameMaker, Adobe PageMaker, Adobe InDesign, Affinity Publisher, Corel Ventura, CorelDraw, Microsoft Publisher, PageStream, and QuarkXPress.ms.

Both of Microsoft's programs, Word and Publisher, have become indispensable tools for desktop publishers and anyone trying to create an item to print or distribute online. These programs provide complete page design capabilities, including magazine style columns, rules and borders, page, chapter and caption numbering as well as precise typographic alignment.

On YouTube, you can find tutorials on how to use these programs to create a newsletter. You don't need to be a graphic designer or a writer to edit the Beacon. This is your chance to make the Beacon your own. You can be as creative as you want. It truly becomes a labor of love.

I will be leaving Rainberry in April but would love to be able to train a replacement.

SCAMS RAMPING UP DURING THE HOLIDAYS*



Fake order scams are increasing for the holiday season. These are sent via fake emails detailing an order update or subscription details, and usually appear to be from a well known brand. The goal, as always, is your money.

HERE'S WHAT IS HAPPENING:

- 1. They come from big brands like Amazon, PayPal, Best Buy, Apple and even Avast. These are just some of the names being impersonated.
- 2. They look real. Scammers are innovative they know how to make these emails look like the real deal.
- 3. Your money is their goal. They encourage you to contact them and ask for your card details to 'rectify or refund' wrong orders.

WHAT CAN I DO TO PROTECT MYSELF?

Keep these 4 tips in mind over the holiday season to help you think twice about what you find online. Remember these key points:

- If you receive an email, even if it appears to be from a big brand —
 double check. You can cross-check the email address with the official
 support on the company's website and contact them directly.
- 2. Be careful as you shop online for better deals on gifts and subscriptions this holiday season. With the cost of everyday items rising around the world, it can be easy to fall for what seems like a great deal.
- 3. Be wary of requests for your personal details. Never send money, credit card details, or copies of your personal documents to anyone legitimate companies will not ask for these in that way.
- Keep your antivirus software updated and running. They work hard to
 protect you from all types of scams, but ones like these prey on human
 weakness. We need to work together with the software to protect
 ourselves.

REPURPOSING SILICA GEL

LOIS WIESLER



Silica gel is a desiccant. In other words, it is a drying agent. It is used to absorb moisture and condensation from the surrounding environment.

PROTECT YOUR ELECTRONICS

- ♦ Save your wet phone. We have all heard of putting your wet phone in with rice. However, silica gel is known to be more effective at sucking out moisture.
- Stick your device directly into a container/bag with as many packets or loose beads as possible and wait 24-48 hours before attempting to turn on your phone.

PROTECT IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS AND BOOKS

- FOR Important Documents, Place a few packages of silica gel beads directly into the folder, filing cabinet, plastic bag, or wherever your documents are being stored.
- Use silica gels for photos, photo albums, and scrapbooks. Consider placing silica gel packets in the sleeves, between pages and throughout the storage containers.
- Rid books of "musty" smells. Old books can sometimes get a musty smell. Place them in a plastic bag with some silica gel and leave it for a few days for a fresh smelling book!

PROTECT DRY FOODS & PET FOODS - DON'T USE LOOSE BEADS.

- If coffee is exposed to too much humidity it can easily become stale. Tape a pack (or two) of silica gel beads to the top of your coffee can lid to keep your coffee moisture free and fresh.
- In high humidity environments, spices can easily absorb too much moisture, start to stick together, and become a solid mass. Avoid this by adding silica gel packs to your spice bags or containers.
- Pet food can be kept fresh and tasty by taping some packets of silica gel to the top of an airtight pet food container.
- Provide storage for your seeds. Silica gel packs can help reduce the humidity and moisture in the environment and keep them ready for next year's planting season.

COMBAT FOG & CONDENSATION

- Keep a couple packages of silica gel on the dashboard of your car to minimize the fog and condensation that often arises on your windshield.
- For the same reasons, silica gel packages placed on window sills around the house can help to minimize the condensation on your windows caused by humidity and temperature changes.

ALMOST THE LAST WORD

This has been one of the most difficult Beacons to produce for me. Most of the delay has come from doing the Memories photographs. Not only did I have to go through the myriads of pictures that I have taken and accumulated between 2005 and today, but in doing so, I released memories I didn't even know I had.

Again, we are looking forward to meeting you all January 8th. So hope you will all come out and say hello! Have a spectacular new year!






